2023 Michigan Turfgrass Conference Recap

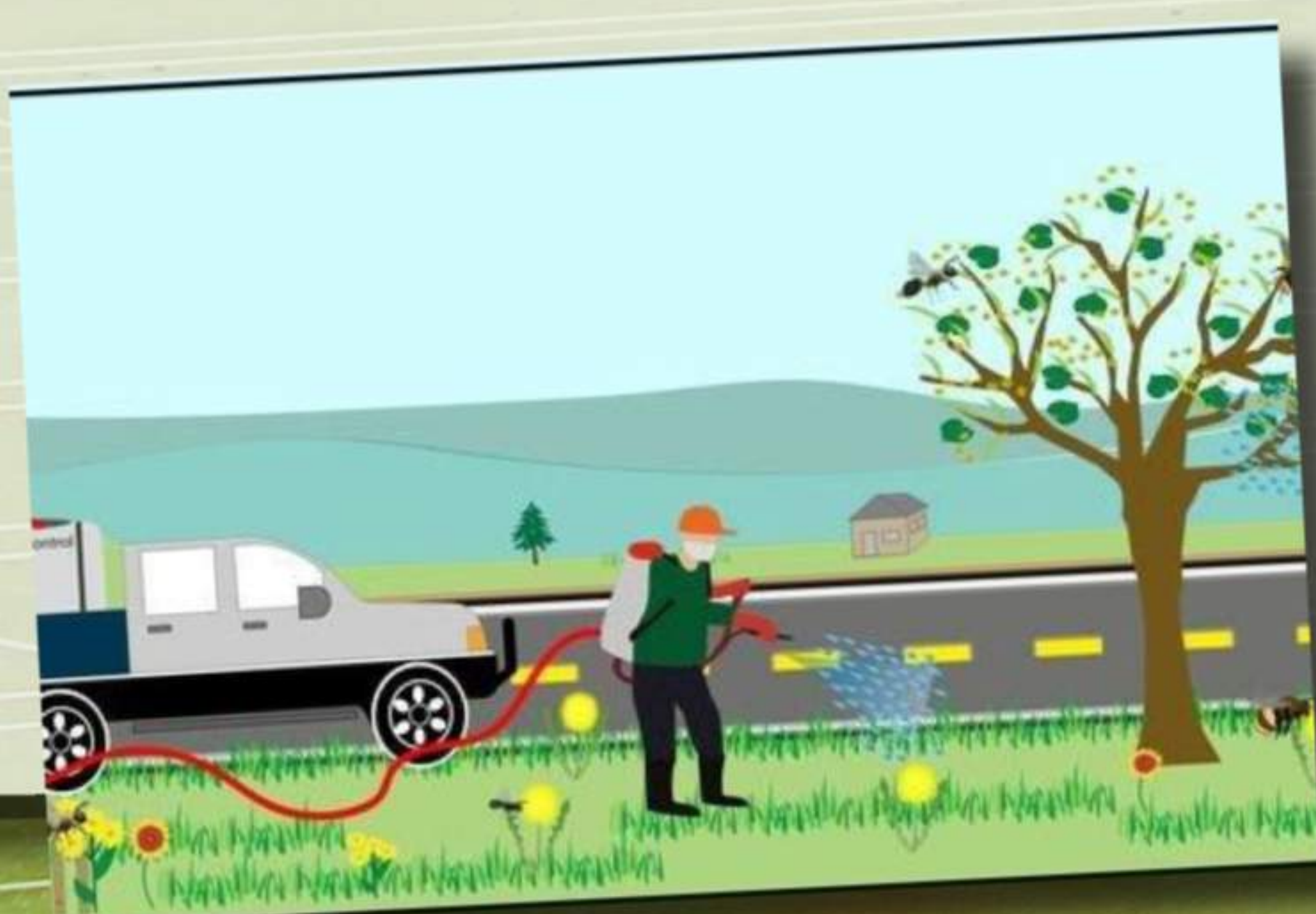

Managing Bentgrass Putting Greens without Plant Growth Regulators



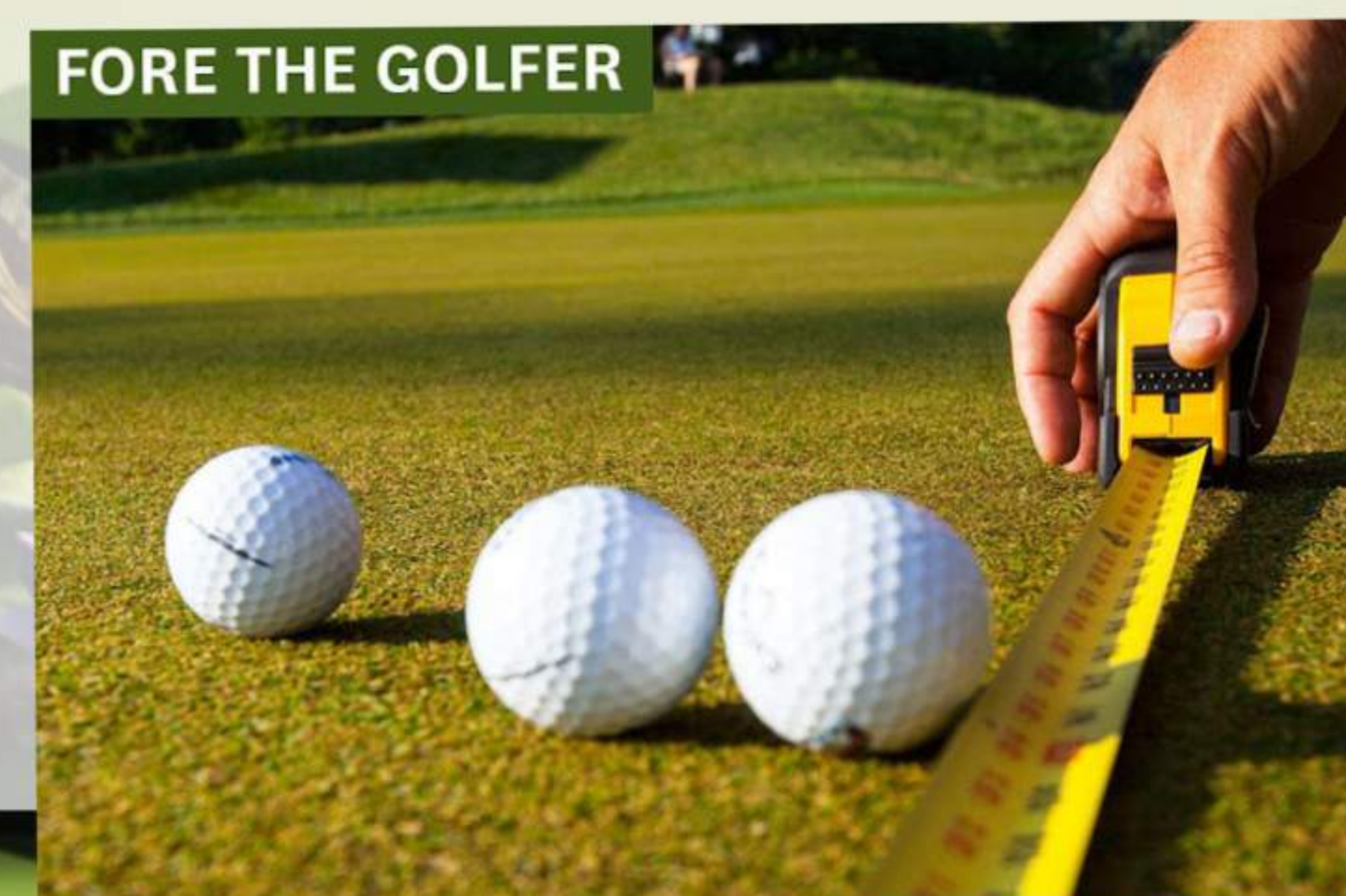
